## Greetings,

I want to thank everyone that is working hard to pull through to the end of the parking lot. It has really helped with unloading students quickly and minimizing the traffic jam. I do want to let everyone know that turning around in the baseball field when it is raining or has rained could cause you to get stuck so please be mindful of that. I would also like to let everyone know that I am working with the Osage County Commissioner and the Sheriff's Dept. on a better solution for our afternoon pickup. Lastly, I need to make everyone aware of a new law that was passed over the summer and goes into effect Aug. 21. Starting Aug. 21 House Bill 1685 prohibits the use of all tobacco products in or on an educational facility that offers an early childhood education program or in which grades Kindergarten through 12 are educated. In addition, the use of a tobacco product is prohibited in school vehicles and at any school-sponsored or school-sanctioned event or activity. This includes smoking in your car on school property. Tobacco products are defined as vapors, e-cigs, cigarettes, and all other tobaccos smokeless or otherwise.
